Habitat for Humanity is one of the world's leading housing charities. Since our founding in 1976, together we have helped more than 62 million people globally build their futures on their own terms through access to decent housing in more than 60 countries worldwide.



What we do:

Our vision is a world where everyone has a safe and decent place to live, and a world where housing poverty and homelessness are eliminated.

To achieve our vision, we build homes, partnerships, communities and networks.

How we do it:

Together, we build homes.

We convene volunteers and organizations to build, improve or facilitate access to millions of homes. In 2023 alone, we helped over 13.4 million people build or improve their homes.

Together, we build a climate-resilient world.

We focus on disaster risk reduction and long-term durability in communities vulnerable to extreme weather and other climate disasters, by using innovative designs and context-appropriate materials.

Together, we build a movement.

In 2024 alone, over 910,412 volunteers built homes, spoke to policymakers, raised awareness and worked in their local areas, in addition to the thousands more who donated and fundraised for Habitat.

Together, we build the future.

Habitat for Humanity supports innovations that can increase access and affordability of decent housing. We look across the system, from construction materials and financial institutions to planning and development.

How does our work make a difference globally?

Our work in Great Britain

Habitat for Humanity Great Britain addresses the housing crisis through key programmes that bring housing and environmental goals together – creating practical, measurable impact for communities and corporate partners alike.

Our pilot Empty Spaces to Homes programme offers an innovative approach to providing affordable housing through the repurposing of vacant commercial and retail spaces into supported accommodation for people at risk of homelessness.

Habitat for Humanity Great Britain's Global Work

In Nepal, we reached 700,000 people through our microfinance programme which supports individuals in gaining access to home improvement loans.

Our programme in Ethiopia to upgrade houses, build community kitchens and toilets, improve sewerage and provide WaSH training helped 8,116 people.

In Zambia, our savings groups and financial inclusion programme supported 92,130 people, building resilience and security within vulnerable communities.
